JETTY TIMBER SALVAGED FOR FUTURE WORKS

Andrew Neighbour, owner of KI Marine Adventures, has been helping Council mill salvaged timber from the Kingscote Jetty into usable pieces for the pergola at Parndana.

Council is working with the Kingscote Men's Shed Inc to see if they can use the salvaged timber to make benches and street furniture for the project.



CONSTRUCTION WORKS

Stage one of construction works on the north side of Dauncey Street will continue next week. Sections of each side of the street have been divided into several work zones.

Works will continue to be scheduled in consultation with business owners and landholders to minimise disruption.

Works include the demolition of the existing pavement and kerbing in preparation for new edging, paving, footpath and tree planting.

DAUNCEY STREET - SPEED LIMIT AND PARKING

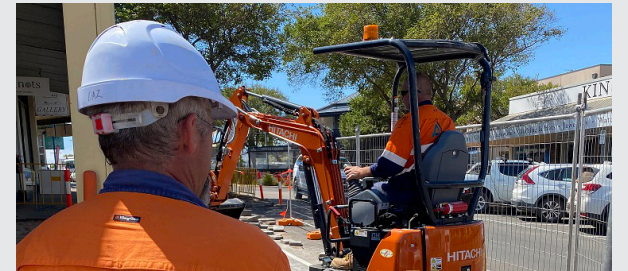
Parking will be restricted along the north side of Dauncey Street. Parking will be available on the southern side of the road. Please remember parking is also available at the back of Council, off Osmond Street and the speed limit between Murray Street and Commercial Street has been reduced to 25km per hour.

HELP US TO HELP YOU

One of Council's obligations to the Kangaroo Island community is to ensure safe and orderly development across the Island's various zones and regions. The Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016 gives Council the responsibility to assess development applications and enforce conditions on development approvals

Breaches of the Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016 can include:

- Undertaking building work without approval.
- Changing land use without approval, or using a structure for a use other than what it was approved for (e.g. building a shed for storage and using it for human habitation)
- Failing to adhere to conditions placed on a development approval, for example not constructing as per the approved plans, CFS fire prevention requirements, stormwater discharge, etc.

It is a requirement of the Act that Council must undertake compliance measures where we are notified or become aware of breaches of the Act. This is to both protect life and property, as well as prevent long term issues with illegal development on the island.

South Australians are warned to avoid exposure to mosquitoes, following the recent detection of various flaviviruses in southern parts of Australia, which are spread through the bite of an infected mosquito.

There have been 77 Ross River cases reported in the State so far this year, compared to 48 cases at the same time last year. This is an even stronger reminder for all South Australians to be vigilant in their fight against mosquito bites.

EVENT ROAD CLOSURE - NEW SHOOTS

New Shoots Music Festival – 2 April 2022

Dry Zone
SAPOL and Council have approved a Dry Zone in Penneshaw from 10:00am Saturday 2nd April to 10:00am Sunday 3rd April 2022 within the shaded area depicted on the map below, being from the western boundary of Cape Willoughby Road, to Cheopis Street in the east and with Mary Seymour Lane and the Penneshaw Golf Course forming the southern perimeter.



Road Closures and Speed Restrictions

Under Section 234A of the Local Government Act 1999, the following road closures and speed restrictions will be in place for the New Shoots Music Festival:-

- Mary Seymour Lane from Middle Terrace to Lashmar Street will be temporarily closed from 11:00am to 12 midnight on the day of the event being Saturday 2nd April 2022.
- A reduced speed limit of 25km/hr on Mary Seymour Lane from Middle Terrace to Lashmar Street from 9:00am Friday 1st April through to Sunday 3rd April at 10:00am, except for the closed period from 11:00am to 12 midnight on Saturday 2nd April 2022 .
- A reduced speed limit of 25km/hr on Middle Terrace from 11:00am to 12 midnight on the day of the event being Saturday 2nd April 2022.
