

TOWN CENTRES PROJECT UPDATE: 24 to 31 MARCH



CONSTRUCTION WORKS

The contractors are working on the concrete edging on the north side of Dauncey Street from Queenie lawn to Murray Street.

The footpath from the Lighthouse Café to Murray Street has been removed in preparation for paving works which will start on the northwest corner working toward Murray Street.

Kerb ramps are currently being installed at Dauncey and Murray Streets intersection.

DAUNCEY STREET - SPEED LIMIT AND PARKING

Parking is temporarily restricted along the north side of Dauncey Street. However, parking is available on the southern side of the road.

Please remember that parking is also available at the back of Council off Osmond Street.

The speed limit between Murray Street and Commercial Street has been reduced to 25km per hour as construction continues.

CONSULTATION WITH LANDOWNERS AND TRADERS

Council continues to consult with landowners and traders on Dauncey Street to ensure minimal disruption to businesses during construction.

Please note that businesses on Dauncey Street will be open during regular trading hours during the upgrade. Access to businesses and shops will remain in place during the construction works.

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATES

Hickman's Road - Guard Railing

Special Local Roads Program funding has enabled Council to upgrade and install guard rail safety barriers on Hickman's Road.

Guardrails are a safety barrier intended to shield a motorist who has left the roadway. They are used in areas where roadways abut steep embankments, side slopes or are lined with trees, retaining walls and utility poles. They also assist with keeping animals and pedestrians from entering traffic areas.

DOG & CAT REGISTRATION RENEWALS

Animal registration was due by 31st of August 2021. Failing to register or renew registration is an offence under the Dog & Cat Management Act 1995 & Council By-Laws.

Council is in the process of contacting owners who have not renewed registration of their dogs or cats. If registration is not renewed by 8th April 2022 expiations will be sent for each offence.

- Unregistered dog expiation \$170
- Unregistered cat expiation \$250

If your dog or cat has passed away, or if your address has changed, you are required to notify Council within 14 days.

- Failure to notify (change of address or deceased animal) \$210

South Australians are warned to avoid exposure to mosquitoes, following the recent detection of various flaviviruses in southern parts of Australia, which are spread through the bite of an infected mosquito.

There have been 77 Ross River cases reported in the State so far this year, compared to 48 cases at the same time last year. This is an even stronger reminder for all South Australians to be vigilant in their fight against mosquito bites.

New Shoots Music Festival – 2 April 2022

Dry Zone

SAPOL and Council have approved a Dry Zone in Penneshaw from 10:00am Saturday 2nd April to 10:00am Sunday 3rd April 2022 within the shaded area depicted on the map below.

The Dry Zone extends from the western boundary of Cape Willoughby Road to Cheopis Street in the east and with Mary Seymour Lane and the Penneshaw Golf Course forming the southern perimeter.



Road Closures and Speed Restrictions

Under Section 234A of the Local Government Act 1999, the following road closures and speed restrictions will be in place for the New Shoots Music Festival:-

- Mary Seymour Lane from Middle Terrace to Lashmar Street will be temporarily closed from 11:00am to 12 midnight on the day of the event being Saturday 2nd April 2022.
- A reduced speed limit of 25km/hr on Mary Seymour Lane from Middle Terrace to Lashmar Street from 9:00am Friday 1st April through to Sunday 3rd April at 10:00am, except for the closed period from 11:00am to 12 midnight on Saturday 2nd April 2022.
- A reduced speed limit of 25km/hr on Middle Terrace from 11:00am to 12 midnight on the day of the event being Saturday 2nd April 2022.
