CONSTRUCTION WORKS

Paving on the northern side of Dauncey Street will continue this week taking in the footpath from the Lighthouse Café to Sani's Salon. The garden beds are being filled with base material ready this week, ready for future planting.

Please note, there will be no construction works on Dauncey Street over Easter and ANZAC Day however some safety barriers and speed limits will remain.

BUSINESSES ARE OPEN - SHOP LOCAL

Please note that businesses on Dauncey Street will be open during regular trading hours during the upgrade.

Access to businesses and shops will remain in place during the construction works. We encourage you to support the Dauncey Street traders and shop local when in Kingscote.

DAUNCEY STREET - SPEED LIMIT AND PARKING

Parking is temporarily restricted along the north side of Dauncey Street. However, parking is available on the southern side of the road.

Please remember that parking is also available at the back of Council off Osmond Street.

The speed limit between Murray Street and Commercial Street has been reduced to 25km per hour as construction continues.

FOOTPATHS IN KINGSCOTE

Council's footpath contractor Denco Civil commenced footpath works Monday, 21 March. Works are planned to be fully completed by the end of April 2022, subject to weather conditions.

Residents directly impacted by the footpath installations have been notified by Council. We thank you in advance for your patience while the footpaths are being constructed.

Footpaths scheduled for construction from March to April are:

- Osmond Street, from Murray Street to Commercial Street on the western side of the street.
- Osmond Street, from Commercial Street to Telegraph Road on the northwestern side of the street.
- Osmond Street, from Commercial Street to Telegraph Road on the southeastern side of the street.
- Murray Street, from Franklin Street to the Ambulance Station driveway on the southeastern side of the street.
- Murray Street, from Osmond Street to Franklin Street on the southeastern side of the street.
- Commercial Street, from Franklin Street to Osmond Street on the southeastern side of the street.
- Murray Street (Opposite Wright Park), from Telegraph Road to the end of Wright Park on the north/northeasterly side of the street.

DOG AND CAT REGISTRATION

Animal registration was due by 31st of August 2021. Failing to register or renew registration is an offence under the Dog & Cat Management Act 1995 & Council By-Laws.

Council is in the process of contacting owners who have not renewed registration of their dogs or cats. If registration is not renewed by 8th April 2022 expiations will be sent for each offence.

- **Unregistered dog expiation \$170**
- **Unregistered cat expiation \$250**

If your dog or cat has passed away, or if your address has changed, you are required to notify Council within 14 days.

- **Failure to notify (change of address or deceased animal) \$210**
