## **TOWN CENTRES PROJECT UPDATE: 14 TO 21 APRIL**



#### CONSTRUCTION WORKS

There will be no construction works on Dauncey Street over the Easter long weekend or on ANZAC Day however some safety barrier and speed limits will remain. Upon work returning on April 26, the construction will switch to the southern side of Dauncey Street. Council will continue to provide information to businesses and traders regarding closures and schedule as this information becomes available.

#### **BUSINESSES ARE OPEN - SHOP LOCAL**

Businesses on Dauncey Street are open during regular trading hours. Access to businesses and shops will remain in place during the construction works.

We encourage you to support the Dauncey Street traders and shop local when you are in Kingscote.

#### **DAUNCEY STREET - SPEED LIMIT AND PARKING**

Parking is temporarily restricted along the north side of Dauncey Street. However, parking is available on the southern side of the road.

Parking is also available at the back of Council off Osmond Street.

The speed limit between Murray Street and Commercial Street has been reduced to 25km per hour as construction continues.

#### **FOOTPATHS IN KINGSCOTE**

Council's footpath contractor Denco Civil commeced footpath works Monday, 21 March. Works are planned to be fully completed by the end of April 2022, subject to weather conditions.

Residents directly impacted by the footpath installations have been notified by Council. We thank you in advance for your patience while the footpaths are being constructed.

Footpaths scheduled for construction from March to April are:

- · Osmond Street, from Murray Street to Commercial Street on the western side of the street.
- Osmond Street, from Commercial Street to Telegraph Road on the northwestern side of the street. · Osmond Street, from Commercial Street to Telegraph
- Road on the southeastern side of the street. Murray Street, from Franklin Street to the Ambulance
- Station driveway on the southeastern side of the street.
- Murray Street, from Osmond Street to Franklin Street on the southeastern side of the street.
- Commercial Street, from Franklin Street to Osmond Street on the southeastern side of the street.
- Murray Street (Opposite Wright Park), from Telegraph Road to the end of Wright Park on the north/ northeasterly side of the street.

### PENNESHAW DRAINAGE

Residents travelling through Cape Willoughby Road will have noticed drainage works through February and March on the Dudley Peninsula.

Council budgeted \$64,000 for improvements to stormwater maintenance in the Dudley Region within the 2021/2022 budget. As a result, Council crews have been clearing out and creating drainage pathways.

Annual rainfall on Kangaroo Island ranges between 400 to 900 mm. The higher rainfall occurs in the elevated, north-western areas of the Island and lower rainfall in the east and south-east. Recent years have seen an increase in storm activity and large dumps of rain.

Strategic stormwater infrastructure and drainage pathways are critical for the redirection and management of annual rain and stormwater.
