

## TOWN CENTRES PROJECT UPDATE: 5 TO 12 MAY



### CONSTRUCTION WORKS

Demolition has commenced on the southern side of Dauncey Street with paving nearly complete on the northern side. Bollards and surrounding paving are being installed with fixing of timber onto the bollards to come. The first delivery of plants are arriving to site this week, with planting and irrigation to start soon after. Council will continue to provide information to businesses and traders regarding closures and schedule as this information becomes available.

### DAUNCEY STREET - SPEED LIMIT AND PARKING

As demolition work on the southern side has commenced, parking on that side will be impacted over the coming weeks. Parking is available at the back of Council off Osmond Street.

The speed limit between Murray Street and Commercial Street has been reduced to 25km per hour as construction continues.

Information Sessions for the next towns will be held later this month. Council will come and meet with traders and hold community meetings for residents to go through the final designs and construction program.

### STORMWATER MAINTENANCE

Each year Kangaroo Island Council Field Crews carry out preventative maintenance on our stormwater infrastructure and a high programming priority is placed on this work leading into the winter months.

Works can involve flushing dirt from stormwater pipes, cleaning rubble and aggregate from stormwater pits and removing foreign matter from the network. Council has specialised equipment that helps to improve the efficiency of cleaning our stormwater infrastructure.

Stormwater maintenance work helps to reduce blocked pipes and increases the efficiency of the stormwater network. Which in turn reduces the risk of flooding to our towns and rural areas.
