

TOWN CENTRES PROJECT UPDATE: 12 TO 19 MAY

CONSTRUCTION WORKS

Demolition continues on the southern side of Dauncey Street with bollards installed that will have a locally sourced timber finish. Formwork for the concrete protuberances are due to commence which will enable the paving to begin on the southern side. The first delivery of plants have arrived waiting for their irrigation to be installed before they are planted out.

The works schedule continues to be reviewed and updated as the project progresses. Council are working closely with businesses and traders ensuring access is maintained and disruptions kept to a minimum.

DAUNCEY STREET - SPEED LIMIT AND PARKING

As demolition work on the southern side has commenced, parking on that side will be impacted over the coming weeks. Parking is available at the back of Council off Osmond Street. The speed limit between Murray Street and Commercial Street has been reduced to 25km per hour as construction continues.
