### **PREVENT MOZZIES FROM BREEDING!**

Check rainwater tanks for gaps, and check that inlet and overflow pipes are covered with insect screens. All rainwater tank openings after 2005 must be fitted with mesh no larger than 1mm.

The only method to remove mozzies from rainwater tanks is to add chemicals. However chemicals contaminate the rainwater. The best thing you can do is seal your tank to protect your water source and prevent

breeding. Other breeding sites that should be checked are:

- Tyres
- Swimming pools
- Garbage bins & recycling bins
- Clogged gutters & runoff
  Swing sets and toys
- Oil drums & buckets
- Novelties & ornamentals
- Boats & kayaks
- Pot plant dishes

# PUBLIC CONSULTATION NOW OPEN DISABILITY AND INCLUSION PLAN

In accordance with Council's Public Consultation Policy, at the October Council Meeting a motion was passed to release the draft Kangaroo Island Council Disability Access and Inclusion Plan 2021 – 2024 for public consultation. Public Consultation is now open for 21 days and closing **5:00pm Sunday 7 November 2021**.

Council is seeking written submissions with respect to the draft Kangaroo Island Council Disability Access and Inclusion Plan 2021 – 2024.

### GRANT FUNDING -FINAL STAGE HICKMANS ROAD

Council has now been notified of its success in the Special Local Roads Program funding of \$1.1 million. Council's 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget allocated \$550,000 towards the project, subject to receipt of \$1.1 million grant funding, which now allows the project to proceed.

Road construction and bitumen sealing will extend 5.8 kilometres from East West Two Highway to South Coast

The project will provide for the upgrade and installation of stormwater drainage, culvert headwalls and upgrade by widening the Eleanor River culverts. Allowance for new road safety barriers, guideposts and warning signage will also be provided.

The project is expected to be completed by late March 2022, subject to favourable weather conditions.

Council's contractor is liaising with individual residents that may be directly affected by the works to minimise any inconvenience.

Roadwork signage is in place advising motorists of the roadworks.

# SOFTFALL REINSTATED AT EMU BAY PLAYGROUND

This past week Council staff removed old and reinstated new softfall at the Emu Bay playground. They undertook this task around challenging weather conditions. Crews are scheduled to start works at Kingscote's playgrounds next week as the 2021/22 playground revitalisation program continues.

Young members of the Island community will see (and feel) the difference.





# **MAYORAL BUSHFIRE FUND TO CLOSE**

Mayor Michael Pengilly established the Mayoral Bushfire Relief and Recovery Fund to raise money to assist those directly impacted by the Bushfires that began on 20 December 2019.
