ADVANCE NOTICE OF ROAD CLOSURE

Section 33 Road Traffic Act 1961

Notice is hereby given that the Kangaroo Island Council make the following order:

That the Council exercises the power pursuant to Section 33(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1961 and Clause G of the Instrument of General Approval of the Minister dated 22 August 2013 to:

1. Pursuant to Section 33(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1961, declare that the events described below ("the Event") that is to take place on the roads described below ("the Roads") is an event to which Section 33 of the Road Traffic Act 1961 applies; and

2. Pursuant to Section 33(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Act 1961, make an order directing that the Roads on which the Event is to be held and any adjacent or adjoining roads specified below, be closed to traffic for the periods specified on 13th March 2022:

Roads: Arranmore Road, between Angle Pole Road and Hog Bay Road

Event: CAMS Time Trial

Date: Sunday March 13th, 2022

Time: Between 7:00am and 7:00pm

3. Pursuant to Section 33(1)(b) of the Road Traffic Act 1961, make an order directing that persons taking part in the Event be exempted, in relation to the Roads, from then duty to observe the Australian Road Rules specified in Clause G4 and G5 of the Instrument of General Approval of the Minister.

4. Detours will be placed to divert traffic around this site. For information please call Kangaroo Island Council on 8553 4500.

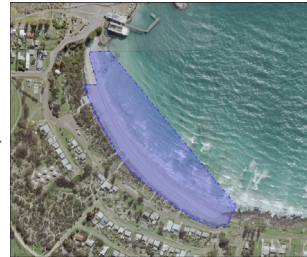
KANGAROO ISLAND COUNCIL DOGS BY-LAW 5

TOWN CENTRES UPGRADES

Notice of advance works: Dauncey Street, Kingscote Works on the Town Centres Project Phase 1 will begin in March.

Stage 1: Northern side of Dauncey Street

Timeframe: Between March and April

The northern side of the street will be closed to traffic while we undertake footpath works. Traffic will be single-lane, southbound (one way) only. Car parking in the northern section will be restricted.

Stage 2: Southern side of Dauncey Street

Timeframe: Between April and May

Once the northern side is completed and reopened, the southern side of the street will be closed to traffic while we undertake footpath works. Traffic will be single-lane, southbound (one way) only. Car parking in the southern section will be restricted.

Stage 3: Dauncey Street - Intersections at Murray and Commercial Street

Timeframe: June (for approximately two weeks)

These intersections will be constructed separately in June, and we will open the road as much as possible while we undertake the work, although there will be traffic diversions required.

General project information:

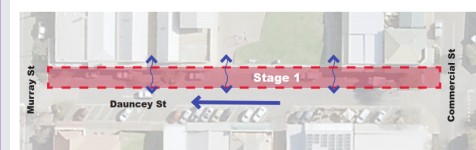
- No work will be undertaken over the Easter period. Dauncey St will be reopened over Easter.
- Pedestrian access to businesses will be maintained
- Vehicle access to side lanes will be maintained.
- Hours of work will generally be 6:30am-6:30pm Monday-Friday. We may also need to work at other times and we will keep you informed should this be necessary.
- The project is expected to be completed by the end of June 2022.

Please note that this is our anticipated program, but these timeframes are subject to change subject to weather conditions.

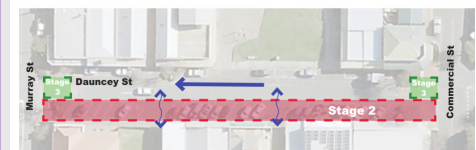
Kingscote: Construction Plan

Stage 1: Upgrade of northern side of Dauncey Street.



- Stage 1:
 - Traffic one way only along Dauncey St
 - Parking restricted along northern side
 - Parking retained on southern side
 - Access to side lanes maintained
 - Pedestrian access to shop fronts on both sides maintained.

Stage 2 & 3: Upgrade of southern side of Dauncey Street plus intersections.



- Stage 2:
 - Traffic one way only along Dauncey St
 - Parking restricted along southern side
 - Parking retained along northern side
 - Access to side lanes maintained
 - Pedestrian access to shop fronts on both sides maintained.
- Stage 3:
 - Intersections constructed separately and traffic restrictions minimised.
