TOWN CENTRES PROJECT UPDATE

KINGSCOTE

Council is working with the contractor to confirm the dates for resurfacing of Dauncey Street which will complete the road level, line marking and drainage. We appreciate your patience during this time while these works are not complete.

Council's CEO Greg Georgopoulos held an open community site walkaround on Friday 30 September. Many of the issues raised will be resolved during the final stage scheduled for late November and December and others will continue to be monitored. The parking on Dauncey Street between Murray and Commercial Streets is pending new line marking (including the wheelchair symbol and the kerb is yet to be raised in front of the Queenscliffe Hotel).

PENNESHAW

Works between Thomas Willson and Nat Thomas Streets continue this week. The upgrade will extend the existing footpaths, enhance street planting and create a more attractive, functional and safe street for pedestrians and motorists. The construction follows a community consultation and design process held throughout 2021 and 2022. Construction work will occur during daylight hours from 7.00 am to 5.00 pm on weekdays.

Traffic and Truck Parking


The road will be open during the construction period. Safe pedestrian access to businesses on Middle Terrace will be maintained throughout the project. Some parking restrictions will be in place.

Hog Bay Road and Middle Terrace are under the care and control of the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT). Council is aware of the issues surrounding the movement of stock freight and access to the SeaLink terminal. Council is advocating for better short and long term parking solutions for heavy vehicles. We will work closely with all key stakeholders throughout the construction phase.

AMERICAN RIVER

The American River upgrade is now complete, and the contractor has demobilised, with only final touches to be completed over the next few days. Council will monitor the amount of rainfall over the coming months and water the new planting as required.





PARNDANA

Council is working with Axiom to lock in a start date that will overlap with the completion of the other townships. Some of the design work will be marked out on Cook Street later this month. Proposed works include street planting to reduce the scale and improve the appearance of Cook Street, with the creation of a town square on Council land next to the Odd Shop to create a destination for locals and visitors.

FIRE PREVENTION - 105F NOTICES

Private landholders are responsible under the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 (the Act) for preparing their properties before the start of the Fire Danger Season.

Under the Act, if a property is not fire ready by 1 December 2022 for fire danger season, Council's Fire Prevention Officers will serve a 105F notice accompanied by a fine of \$473

Landholders then have 21 days to complete the required works after receiving a 105F notice. If after 21 days the required works have not been done, Council will engage a contractor to complete the necessary works with the cost applied to the property owner and charged against the land.


