Kangaroo Island Council is seeking information regarding the circumstances of and/or history associated with the transfer of the following land parcles into council ownership:

10 Cook Street, Parndana CT5684/269





This parcel of land in Parndana's Town centre has housed for many years the Lions Odd Shop as well as the Spinner's Building.

The land was transferred to the District Council of Kingscote by Mr Archibald Lovering during his lifetime, with the transfer being finalised in April 1976.

The land was acquired by the District Council of Dudley for what appears to be no consideration with the transfer

being finalised on 15 November 1994. The land parcel was created as a result of the subdivision of a larger piece of land owned by Doris Muriel Hill that was subdivided into 4
