## EASTER RUBBISH REMINDERS

- All kerbside bin collections will occur on the day scheduled, even on Good Friday and Easter Monday. General waste to landfill (red lid) bins are collected in the week before and after Easter.

- Kangaroo Island Resource Recovery Centre (KIRRC) will be closed on Good Friday, otherwise open usual days and times.

- Easter egg foil is recyclable, scrunch into fist sized balls and place in the recycling bin.

- All food waste including domestic quantities of seafood shells, meat and bone, can go in the green organics bin.

- Gather up those 10c refund cans, bottles and cartons and return to Havechat Bottle, Can and Scrap depot to get some pocket money for the holidays.

## LONG TERM FINANCIAL PLAN

Council's Draft Long Term Financial Plan FY2021-2030 is now available for public consultation in accordance with Council's Consultation Policy for 21 days from Wednesday 31 March to close of business Wednesday 21 April 2021.

The *Local Government Act 1999* requires that a Council must develop and adopt a Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) for a period of at least 10 years and must undertake a review of this as soon as practicable after adopting the Council's Annual Business Plans for a particular financial year.

The information contained within a LTFP is presented at a high level, it is not a detailed budget and does not 'commit' council to the spending or assumptions outlined within the LTFP. Council uses the information within the LTFP to:

- inform future decision making of council;
- understand the level of financial and interest rate risk exposure;
- confirm adequacy of spending on assets and capital renewal;
- allow the ability to track performance against key financial ratios; and
- inform decisions around future service levels and service provision.

Kangaroo Island Council's Long Term Financial Plan FY2021-2030 is currently available to view and your written feedback is encouraged during the consultation period.

Copies of the plan and feedback sheets are available on Council's website, at Customer Service 43 Dauncey Street Kingscote, or Penneshaw Community Business Centre, Middle Terrace, Penneshaw.

A report containing all submissions on the draft LTFP FY2021-2030 will be presented to the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on Tuesday 11 May 2021.

## ACCESSIBILITY AUDIT

Warwick Gregg from Able Access Design knows a thing or two about the challenges of navigating our built environment after a mountain bike accident many years ago left him as a quadriplegic. Through the LGA's Accessible Destinations program he's working with local governments to advocate for change in our built environments and create inclusive spaces for all.

Following a training day earlier this month in Victor Harbor, our design and assets team spent some time with Warwick (who runs his audits armed with a motorised wheelchair, a level and a laser measure) to understand firsthand the many challenges users with a range of physical and intellectual disabilities can experience on a day-to-day basis.

This audit of Kingscote and Penneshaw will shape our thinking moving forward as we develop a detailed design for our Town Centres Project and upcoming capital works.

## OPERATIONS UPDATE

After completing two major capital projects Playford Highway and Hickman's Road, our Council Works and Infrastructure team has moved onto programmed renewal reseals of council roads.

- To date we have completed;
- 4 km of reseal on South Coast Between Timber Creek Road and Old South Coast Road.
  - 2 km of Seal Bay Road from South Coast Road towards Seal Bay.
  - 2 km of Birchmore Road - north and south of the Stars Road intersection.

Some minor speed restrictions remain in place to allow the seal to bed in properly - please be patient and adhere to posted speed limits on the recently resealed roads.

- Looking forward the team will carry out reseals on:
- Buick Street and Hawthorn Avenue at Emu Bay.
  - Falie Court, Nelcebe Court and Warawee Road in American River.
  - Murray Street, Kingscote Terrace/Commercial Street and Addison Street in Kingscote.
