PUBLIC CONSULTATION COMMUNITY LAND MANAGEMENT PLAN CONSULTATIONS

Public Consultation on Amendments to the Council Lands Management Plan.

Council is considering amendments to the Council Lands Management Plan: Community Land Data Sheets listed below. We are inviting interested persons to make written submissions in relation to the matter.

What are Community Land Management Plans?

All local government land, except for roads, owned by the Council or under the Council's care and control, including Crown Land, is classified as community land unless the Council has resolved to exclude the land from its community land or has otherwise revoked its community land status.

The Local Government Act 1999 requires Council to prepare and adopt a Community Land Management Plan (CLMP) for all community land. The plans provide details of the land and outline how the Council will manage and maintain the land held for the community's use and enjoyment.

Council is currently reviewing several of its CLMPs that require amendment to comply with the Local Government Act 1999 and updating the proposals for land management, including the CLMPs listed below.

The details of the updated CLMPs for public consultation include:

- . Details of the land.
- The purpose for which the Council holds the land.
- . State the Council's objectives.
- policies and proposals for management of the land.
- Outlines Council's performance targets and methods of measuring performance against the stated objectives.

At its meeting on 9 April 2024 Council resolved to seek public consultation on the following proposed amended Community Land Management Plan (CLMP) Data Sheets:

PROJECT UPDATE

Kingscote School Crossing -Centenary Avenue

Council continues to liaise with the Department of Transport and Infrastructure. SAPOL and the community to review and assist with improvements within School zones

Works at Centenary Avenue on a new Emu (flag) school crossing have now been completed. Required kerbing, linemarking, signage and modifications to the footpaths has been installed to revitalise the

Motorists are advised to be aware that there may be additional pedestrian movements around and on this new crossing.

Emu crossings are part time crossings. They are operational when the "Children Crossing" flags are displayed. KICE also provides student crossing monitors to supervise the crossing of children and adults.

What should drivers do?

As emu crossings are in school zones, drivers must travel at no more than 25km/hr at any time when children are present on the road or footpath.

Drivers must stop for anyone using the crossing or about to use the crossing when flags are displayed.

Drivers must not park within 20 meters of the approach to an emu crossing or within 10 meters after passing it.
