3.1 Business arising from previous record notes:

Kingscote

Road watch sign on Burdon Drive – what is the purpose, who installed them?

ACTION: Group discussed these are out of date, from a period when residents in the area were undertaking roadside cleanups and that they should now be removed.



Parndana

Check Town Hall budget to see if Council can get windows cleaned

5. Current Business

5.1 Township Updates

5.1.1 Penneshaw

-) Jacks creek bridge is being reinstalled with crane today
-) Very successful opening of the swing bridge despite pouring rain and thunderstorms
-) Cemetery – discussed request for a columbarium to hold ashes, possible locations and planning considerations. PPA to put proposal in writing to Council, suggest approaching Lions Club who may be able to assist with funding
-) Blitz spreadsheet now covers a lot of requests/outstanding items
-) Working towards revamping Dudley Hall once roof situation has been sorted, have someone offering money to fund this. Council have re-inspected this week, roof is sound, suggest 4-10 year lifespan, PPA to make decision should they wish to proceed with reroofing. Suggest talking with Council officers RE lino to be removed, floor resurfacing is occurring in June. Artist screens have been removed by Council today.
-) We have had an inquiry for a wedding, and a concert, but the hall needs a lot of TLC. It gives us hope that the hall can once again bring in some income for the Council when we finish.
-) Progressing with water in gardens
-) Thank you for ramp by chemist, being finished today
-) Council requested Telstra relocate the cable within the cemetery, working with Lynn Wright on updating records

5.1.2 Sapphiretown and Island Beach

-) No Update

5.1.3 Baudin Beach

-) Repainting shelter shed, working on the interior first
-) FRWA have provided Progress an extra green bin for gardening
-) Having a briefing on the Cat Eradication Program at our next meeting
-) Cleaning contract, planning to renew for next year, have submitted on tenders website, awaiting reference number
-) Memorial plaque installed on seat

5.1.4 American River

-) Drainage works underway
-) American River resort and golf course not likely to continue
-) Blitz spreadsheets – Council compliment ARPA on completing the documentation so far, covering issues such as memorial seats, adult play equipment, unisex toilet at playground (long-term)
-) Using hall for variety of functions, guitar festival in July

5.1.5 Kingscote

-) Painted the gun at the oval before ANZAC day
-) Memorial bricks project is ongoing, next order and bricks will be later this year
-) Stake park panels damage, has been reported to police

ACTION: Council to write to KI Football League and School regarding recent damage

-) Work continues on strategic plan
-) Silo committee formed, speaking with artist – please invoice Council for grant funds before 30 June
-) Walking trail progressing, looking great
-) Replanting at entrance to Kingscote has occurred

Emu Bay

Ann Jamieson was at the meeting for AKPA, so took the opportunity to update the Group on what's happening at Emu Bay:

-) Met with Michael Pengilly earlier this year, have those requests in hand
-) Working with Veronica Bates on revegetation plan along foreshore
-) History signs being installed in shelter shed
-) North Coast Road Intersection – Council have 16 more bars to install, sign on North Coast Road still to come out
-) Emily's popup food van working great for community
-) Lots of work has been done at Cemetery - signage and log as contemplation seat, will keep working on
-) Adam Street auction 13 June
-) Next working bee in the playground in September
-) Emu Bay Progress currently have 75 members

5.1.6 Parndana

-) No update provided

6. General Business

-) Town blitz spreadsheet – continue to work on these, and liaise with John Fernandez. Feedback on this initiative so far has been pleasing. Council will now undertake inspections to document resources, add some of our own tasks and prioritise jobs.
-) Council have just been notified of Tour DeCure Cycling event visiting this weekend.
-) Boating Facilities Committee have suggested meetings move towards a quarterly schedule, this will be reviewed in November when the dates for 2020 are confirmed. This Group may wish to also consider this.
-) Council have been contacted by KI Marathon organisers for next year, and are working on a route in the American River area.
-) Plogathon happening in June – all the rubbish will be collated at KI Brewery for a photo shoot.
-) Council have been successful with a grant application for \$50,000 for African Boxthorn on the Dudley Peninsula, this work will be undertaken by the NRM Board.
